On this Sunday, we continue to read from the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John. Today's Gospel elaborates further on the teaching that Jesus began in our liturgy last week. In that reading, the crowds wondered about how Jesus could say that he had come down from heaven because they knew Jesus to be the son of Joseph. In this Gospel, some have difficulty with Jesus' teaching that he is the living bread sent from God. Recall that Jesus had told them that just as God gave the Israelites manna to sustain them in the desert, so now God has sent new manna that will give eternal life. We hear the concluding verse of last week's Gospel repeated in today's reading: Jesus himself is the bread sent by God; Jesus' flesh is the bread that is given for the life of the world.

Among the stumbling blocks for those who heard but did not understand Jesus is the teaching that the bread that Jesus will give is his own flesh. In response to the people who quarreled over his words, Jesus teaches with even greater emphasis that salvation comes to those who eat his Body and Blood. Jesus doesn't seem to answer the question posed about how salvation will come about, perhaps because this reality can only be understood after his death and Resurrection. Instead, Jesus teaches about the life that he will give to the world.

To many ears, Jesus' words are jarring and difficult to hear. Many who heard Jesus could not accept what he said. Many today continue to struggle to accept these words. But they are important words because they reveal our intimate connection with Jesus.

This is the mystery that is at the heart of our eucharistic theology. In the elements of bread and wine, Jesus' Body and Blood are made truly present. When we share in the Body and Blood of Christ, Jesus himself comes to dwell within us. This communion with the Lord makes us one body, brings us eternal life, and sends us forth to be Christ's body for the life of the world.



New York's PROPOSITION ONE: so-called Equal Rights Amendment

What the Media doesn't want you to know about the proposed equality amendment are the changes to the language of it. It will create a constitutional right to "reproductive healthcare and autonomy" for "persons."

Notably absent from its text are the words and phrases "MINOR," "PARENT," "CONSCIENCE," and "LATE TERM." We need to understand the real-life legal ramifications of this poorly written one size fits all amendment.

The proposed bill states: NYS Legislature bills: A1283 and S108A

"No person shall be denied the equal protection of the laws of this state and any subdivision thereof. No person shall, because of race, color, ethnicity, national origin, age, disability, creed, religion, or sex, including sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, pregnancy, pregnancy outcomes, and reproductive healthcare and autonomy, be subject to discrimination in their civil rights by any other person or by any firm, corporation, or institution, or by any agency or subdivision of the state, pursuant to law."

This "Equality Amendment" could empower unaccountable state judges and bureaucrats to:

• DISCRIMINATE against BABIES, EVEN IN THE NINTH MONTH OF PREGNANCY, by denying their right to life by endorsing their killing by abortion, including painful late term abortion, and by infanticide through intentional neglect if the baby is born alive after an attempted abortion.

DISCRIMINATE against social workers, educators and health care workers, <u>INCLUDING DOCTORS AND NURSES</u> by denying them state licenses if they refuse to do abortion referrals.

DISCRIMINATE against PARENTS by denying parents the right to require their consent for their minor age daughters being given an abortion while requiring the consent of parents for their minor age daughters being given an aspirin.
 DISCRIMINATE (IN FAVOR OF ABORTIONISTS) by awarding abortionists the PRIVILEGE of operating without the

health and safety regulations lifesaving surgeons and pharmacists must adhere to.

This "Equality Amendment" can empower unaccountable state judges and bureaucrats to regulate, harass, fine and prosecute public pro-life witnessing and crisis pregnancy centers out of existence as violators of the "Civil Right" of

"Reproductive Healthcare and Autonomy."

Diving Deeper Into the Prop One: Equal Rights Amendment

Let's take a moment and ask ourselves some questions about what it means to be able to "discriminate" based on things like age and gender identity and what some possible legal ramifications might be.

Should the New York State government have more authority than parents in making medical and other important decisions for children?

NO.

Should minors have the right to irreversible surgical and non-surgical transgender procedures without parental notice or consent?

NO.

Should biological males be allowed to compete in female school sports without restrictions?

NO.

Should laws that determine the legal age to purchase and/or consume alcohol or cannabis be weakened?

NO.

Should statutory rape laws that protect against sex with minors be weakened?

NO.

The Consequences

If entities cannot "discriminate" based on age and gender identity or expression, under the new amendment language, medical providers could be required to facilitate a child's request to make permanent, life-altering "gender affirming" decisions and they would not need to consult with parents. Additionally, biological males would have a constitutional right to compete in girls' school sports.

Laws that determine the legal age to purchase and/or consume alcohol or cannabis, determine elder abuse and statutory rape could all be weakened because they "discriminate" based on age.

If these poorly written one-size-fits-all additions to the amendment pass, each of these common sense guard rails that protect kids could be deemed unconstitutional under the New York State Constitution.

The proposed amendment opens the floodgates for the New York State Government to wield more authority than parents regarding important decisions for their minor children.
