On January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court legalized abortion throughout the United States in its companion decisions Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton. Since that time, millions of children have lost their lives, and millions of women and families have been wounded by abortion.

On June 24, 2022, the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization decision overturned Roe v. Wade, and we praise God for

the great opportunity state and federal legislators now have to protect pre-born children. While God, in His mercy, ended the nearly fifty-year nationwide regime of abortion on demand, right now state and federal laws, in many instances, are still hostile to pre-born children. So, great prayer and advocacy is very needed.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children":

In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dig-

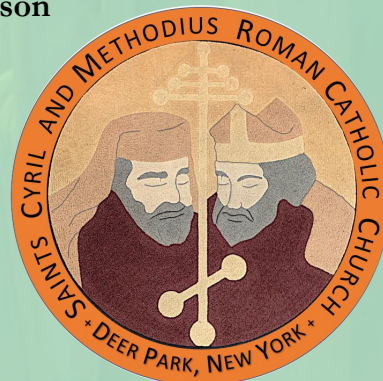

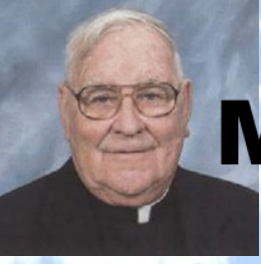

Dear Parishioners.

Many have asked why Fr. Christopher Deh is noticeably absent. Fr. Chris left for Ghana middle of November last year to renew his religious worker VISA. Until now, he is having difficulty returning to the United States because of some technical issues in the US embassy in Accra. He continues to update me and the diocese but as of this writing everything is left hanging. We are not sure when he is able to get his Visa processed and return to work. Please pray for him that he can return to us sooner than later.

Because of this, we are short of priestly coverage in the parish. I'm sure you are aware that our parish is one of the biggest in Long Island. We are probably the only parish that offers 3 daily weekday Masses and 8 Masses in the weekend. On top of this, we also get quite a bit of Funerals, Weddings and Baptisms. With this set-up, the parish requires at least 3 full time clergy. Right now, there are only 2 full time priests, Fr. Paul and myself, and Fr Greg who occasionally helps out in Masses.

There is a recent development. As a background, in January of last year, I had applied to the diocese to go on an intensive immersive Spanish language learning program. I feel that learning Spanish will help me respond to a pressing ministerial need in our parish, especially with the dual language program of Our Lady of Guadalupe School and would eventually help me serve a growing number of parishes with this ministry in Long Island. Occupied with resolving its bankruptcy case, the diocese has delayed the approval of my application. But finally last week I received the good news that the bishop has approved it. He is sending me to Mexico City to study at the Seminario Hispano de Santa Maria de Guadalupe for their immersive language course. The program is 8 weeks. I am arranging it so that I can return to the parish in the last week of March in time for Holy Week preparations.

On this note, I am making a difficult but necessary decision. Beginning January 27, I am temporarily suspending the 7:00 am weekday Mass (Monday to Friday). I have noticed that it is the least attended of all the 3 daily Masses. I am unable to say when we will restore it, but I will review it again when I return from my studies. It will depend largely on when Fr Chris returns. As of now, we are working on transferring the Mass intentions to either the 8:30 am or 12:15 pm Masses. We will be communicating with those who have offered intentions for these Masses.

I have arranged for priestly coverage and making sure that Fr. Paul is not working 7 days a week but is able to get his weekly days off. Fr. Dante Sabban, whom we recently hosted has finally received a permanent position in St. Thomas Parish in Hempstead. But he promised to help from time to time. Fr. Daniel Rivera, pastor of St. John of God Parish in Central Islip has generously offered to help. And I have 2 other priest friends, Fr. Andy Egargo and Fr. Noel Sixon, whom you may have met already, who will be on stand by. And of course Fr. Greg has committed to help.

Let us pray for one another that things may get resolved, that we may continue to respond actively to God's call for mission, and for our parish that we may truly mature in faith, hope and charity.

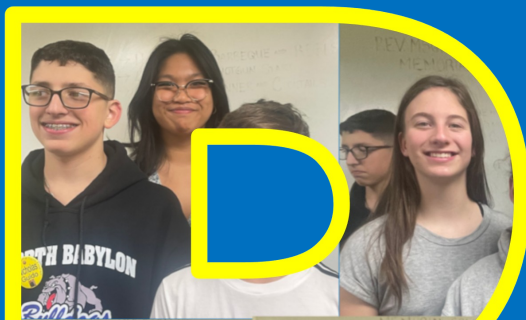
