



As Christians, there are two dominant symbols that are most associated with Easter. First is the **Empty Tomb** and second the Paschal Lamb.

On the third day after his crucifixion, the women who had been followers went to his tomb and found it empty. They told the disciples, some of whom also went to the tomb and found it empty. And they left wondering what had happened to Jesus' body? Why is the empty tomb important? Its primary importance is that it points to the bodily resurrection of Jesus. That death could not hold him. And because Jesus has risen, we can look forward to our own resurrection as well. The empty tomb demonstrates that death is not the end of the journey. There is much more to come. This Sunday, as you return the nails that were given to you on Holy Friday, you profess the truth of the empty tomb: Death has no power over Christ!



FROM THE PASTOR

The second powerful symbol of Easter is the Easter or Paschal lamb which symbolizes the Risen Lord, Jesus Christ. The Lamb of God is the Christian symbol of the Passover Sacrifice of Jesus' Death to Life. A picture can be found on page 5. As part of a yearly tradition, you may tear out the page and tape it by your front window or the storm door of your home, witnessing to what we believe as Catholic Christians: "We are an Easter People and Alleluia is our song." The symbol of the Lamb remains in a prominent place in our homes from today Easter Sunday until the Easter season is completed 50 days later on Pentecost Sunday (June 8, 2025). It is taken down at the end of the day.


Thank you for your generous support to your Church family.

Today we begin the Easter Season, our 50-day meditation on the mystery of Christ's Resurrection. Our Gospel today tells us about the disciples' discovery of the empty tomb. It concludes by telling us that they did not yet understand that Jesus had risen from the dead. Thus, the details provided are not necessarily meant to offer proof of the Resurrection. The details invite us to reflect upon a most amazing gift, that is faith in Jesus and his Resurrection.

Each of the four Gospels tells us that Jesus' empty tomb was first discovered by women. This is notable because in first-century Jewish society women could not serve as legal witnesses. In the case of John's Gospel, the only woman attending the tomb is Mary of Magdala. Unlike the Synoptic accounts, John's Gospel does not describe an appearance of angels at the tomb. Instead, Mary is simply said to have observed that the stone that had sealed the tomb had been moved, and she runs to alert Simon Peter and the beloved disciple. Her statement to them is telling. She assumes that Jesus' body has been removed, perhaps stolen. She does not consider that Jesus has been raised from the dead.

Simon Peter and the beloved disciple race to the tomb, presumably to verify Mary's report. The beloved disciple arrives first but does not enter the tomb until after Simon Peter. This detail paints a vivid picture, as does the detail provided about the burial cloths. Some scholars believe that the presence of the burial cloths in the tomb offers evidence to the listener that Jesus' body had not been stolen (it is understood that grave robbers would have taken the burial cloths together with the body).

The Gospel passage concludes, however, that even having seen the empty tomb and the burial cloths, the disciples do not yet understand about the Resurrection. In the passage that follows, Mary of Magdala meets Jesus but mistakes him for the gardener. In the weeks ahead, the Gospel readings from our liturgy will show us how the disciples came to believe in Jesus' Resurrection through his appearances to them. Our Easter faith is based on their witness to both the empty tomb and their continuing relationship with Jesus—in his appearances and in his gift of the Holy Spirit.

We are memorializing 2 **Paschal Candles**. These bees wax candles are consistently present and used in liturgies connected to Easter, and likewise during Funerals and Baptisms. We have ordered 2 as we have always done in the past since we always finish 1 in the middle of the liturgical cycle. The name of the person being remembered will be printed and pasted at the base of the Paschal candle.

We have also purchased matching vestments to be used for solemn liturgical celebrations with concelebrants such as on Easter, Christmas and other important Feasts and Solemnities. We have a **Presider's chasuble, 3 Concelebrants chasubles** and a **Dalmatic** for the deacon. For an extra cost, the name of the person to be memorialized may be embroidered on a cloth and sewn at inside back of the vestment.





We are also in the process of purchasing 2 sets of Stacking Ciboria with cover as we retire our older ones which are faded and worn out. You may wish to memorialize a whole set of 3 or just an individual ciborium. This is a good way to remember a family member or friend who has passed who served as a Extra Ordinary Minister of the Holy Eucharist or someone who had a very strong dedication to the Holy Eucharist. For an extra cost, the name of the person being remembered maybe engraved at the base of the ciborium.
