Mother's Day is a wonderful opportunity to highlight the beautiful vocation of motherhood and the gift of human life. It calls us to cherish the gift of life that we receive from our mothers and to pray for all women to whom God has entrusted life in a very special way. As we pray in thanksgiving for the gift of mothers, we remember mothers experiencing difficult pregnancies and pray they may find support and encouragement in choosing life for their children.

While Mother's Day is not a liturgical or Catholic observance, many parishes still use this holiday to honor and pray for mothers. The month of May has traditionally been dedicated to Mary, Mother of Jesus. Mother's Day provides an opportunity to pray for mothers while honoring and seeking the intercession of Our Blessed Mother. It is a fitting day to ask God's special blessing on all mothers.

In our efforts to celebrate the vocation of motherhood, it is also important to remember that Mother's Day can be a difficult holiday for many people: married couples struggling with infertility; parents who have lost a child; those who have lost their own mothers; couples longing to welcome a child through adoption; and women and men who are suffering because of their participation in abortion. As one community, we remember them in prayer.

How did Pope Francis reach out?

ASKING THE CLERGY

Widespread mourning and glow-ing tributes have followed the April 21 death of Pope Francis, the first Catholic pontiff from the Amer-icas and from the Southern Hemi-sphere. This week's commenters dis-cuss why Francis' 12-year papacy and its commitment to interfaith dialogue and oracial interior are also represent by reaches social justice are also revered by people of other faiths.

A day after Pope Francis' demise, my friend and Hindu leader Rajan Zed organized a prayer meeting in Reno, Nevada, featuring religious leaders from all major faiths and Christian denominations. This demonstrated to me the Braz's reputation or a bridge denominations. This demonstrated to me the Pope's reputation as a bridge builder. What endeared him to so many people and alarmed some Catholics was his statement to a Singapore crowd in 2024, "All religions are paths to God." Hindus like me found him echoing the Rig Veda: "Ekam sat viprah bahuda vadanti" (There is one truth, the wise talk about it verily). While other popes before him had held ecumenical and interreligious dialogues. Pope Francis interreligious dialogues, Pope Francis made it central to his papacy. Last week's article from Vatican News de-tails his numerous interfaith summits and interreligious encounters, including with Islam. It was crucial, he had said

soon after his election in 2013, "to inten-sify outreach to nonbelievers, so that the differences which divide and hurt us may never prevail." When a Jain delegation visited him in the Vatican last year, he reiterated the shared belief that all humans, created equal in dignity, are called to live as brothers and sisters. Such sentiments coming from the "People's Pope" always sounded genuine and purposeful.

he Baha'is of Long Island join worldwide Baha'i communities in reflec-tion on the legacy of Pope Francis, partic-ularly his work on interfaith understand-ing. Because his aspirations have much in common with the principles and practices of the Baha'i Faith on that topic, we join people of goodwill every-where in mourning the loss of this hum-

ble man of service to humanity. The pope's focus on interfaith dia-The pope's focus on interfaith dia-logue as a means towards peace and justice was certainly his greatest contri-bution. His statement that "We are all children of God" aligns with the concept of the oneness of humanity, the pivot round which all the teachings of Baha'u'llah, the founder of the Baha'i faith revolve Just as the rope spoke of faith, revolve. Just as the pope spoke of the importance of interfaith relation-ships in recognizing the beliefs that different faiths hold in common, Baha'is baliage that says the poper of the the second different faiths hold in common, Baha'is believe that revelation from God has been progressive, with the spiritual teachings being the same and the social teachings varying according to the needs of the time. Additionally, the pope's important efforts to deepen understand-ing with leaders of other religions, largely through conversation mirror the largely through conversation, mirror the Baha'i practice of consultation, where those involved seek out truth and come to a unified resolution, thereby building relationships based on unity and love.

RABBI LINA ZERBARINI Kehillath Shalom Synagogue, Cold Spring Harbor

Cold Spring Harbor could speak of Pope Francis' building relationships with the Jewish commu-nity through visits to synagogues and to Israel, his condemnation of all forms of antisemitism as "a sin against God," and his statement that "God is God for all; and if God is God for all, then we are all sons and daughters of God." But for me, his greatest contribu-tion was the example of his life. Through both his words and actions, he proclaimed: "Care for those in need." This is a universal message but also draws directly from our shared sacred text: "God... provides justice for orphan and widow, and loves the sojourner, by giving them food and clothing. So you are to love the so-journer, for sojourners were you in the land of Egypt!" (Deuteronomy 10:18). One of the main messages of the Torah and of Jewish tradition that grew out of it is that we must care for the vul-nerable. As 19th century Rabbi Israel Salanter said: "Someone else's material nerable. As 19th century Rabbi Israel Salanter said: "Someone else's material needs are my spiritual responsibility." We envision the same kind of world: A world in which humans recognize each other as the Divine presence itself. I pray that my own life will further his message.



We are memorializing 2 **Paschal Candles**. These bees wax candles are consistently present and used in liturgies connected to Easter, and likewise during Funerals and Baptisms. We have ordered 2 as we have always done in the past since we always finish 1 in the middle of the liturgical cycle. The name of the person being remembered will be printed and pasted at the base of the Paschal candle.

(As of this publication, 1 Paschal Candle has already been taken for memorialization.)

We have also purchased matching vestments to be used for solemn liturgical celebrations with concelebrants such as on Easter, Christmas and other important Feasts and Solemnities. We have a **Presider's chasuble, 3 Concelebrants chasubles** and a **Dalmatic** for the deacon. For an extra cost, the name of the person to be memorialized may be embroidered on a cloth and sewn at inside back of the vestment.





We are also in the process of purchasing **2 sets of Stacking Ciboria** with cover as we retire our older ones which are faded and worn out. You may wish to memorialize a whole set of 3 or just an individual ciborium. This is a good way to remember a family member or friend who has passed who served as a Extra Ordinary Minister of the Holy Eucharist or someone who had a very strong dedication to the Holy Eucharist. For an extra cost, the name of the person being remembered maybe engraved at the base of the ciborium.
