Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

June 22, 2025

On the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, it is fitting to once again note a few reminders on the proper reception of the Eucharist at communion.

BEFORE: While waiting for the person in front of you to receive, recollect yourself for a moment and before stepping up when it is your turn, bow your head as a gesture of adoration.

DURING: Communion in the hand and directly on the tongue are the two forms allowed in the United States by decision of the American Bishops. If one is receiving in the hand: upon approaching the minister of the Host extend the hands in the middle of the chest. The left hand is extended, with the right hand under the left in support (left handed persons may wish to place the left hand under the right). In essence, a throne is formed in the sign of an X-cross to receive the Sacred Host. The response of "**Amen**" is given to the proclamation "The Body of Christ," and the sacred Host is received. The individual should then step to the side and receive the Host carefully and reverently. It is unseemly to "pop" the Host into the mouth as one walks away. Remember "Who" you are receiving! Please note that it is never acceptable to put out only one hand due to the danger of dropping the host. Those who do not have the easy use of both hands (or whose hands are not perfectly clean for whatever reason) should receive on the tongue.

AFTER: The rubrics does not require making the sign of the cross after communion and has never been prescribed by Instruction on the Roman Missal. A slight bow of reverence is more appropriate.

If by accident you drop the Body of Christ, you may choose to pick it up and consume it. If not, please do not dispose of it yourself. Pick it up and reverently hand it back to the Communion minister who will know how to dispose of it properly.

Catholic Social Teaching PERICHORESIS

A word not many are familiar with. The early church fathers knew and taught it. It is the Divine Dance. That is to say, the mystery of the Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The early fathers thought of it as an active thing, a dance.

"If you spell out the.. Greek word, peri-choresis, you can hear what the word conveys: 'Peri' (from which we get the words such as 'perimeter") and 'choresis' (from which we get our word "choreography" -a dancing circle. The word describes the interrelationships of the persons of the Trinity. That in everything God the Trinity is and does, each of the persons relates to and engages with each of the other persons. Like an eternal dance, the "choreography" of the Divine Being is singular in its diversity and diverse in its unity. And for church fathers, one beautiful way of understanding our salvation is our being invited into this dance. Rankin Wilbourne, Union with Christ, p.101

Participating in the divine dance of the Trinity is there for all of us.

"The whole dance, or drama, or pattern of this three-Personal life is to be played out in each one of us: or (putting it another way round) each one of us has got to enter that pattern, take his place in the dance. There is no other way to the happiness for which we were made... Once a man is united to God, how could he not live forever? ... But how is he to be united to God? How is it possible for us to be taken into the three-Personal life? Now the whole offer which Christianity makes is this: that we can, if we let God have His way, come to share in the life of Christ ... The whole purpose of becoming Christian is simply nothing else" C.S. Lewis, Mere Christianity, IV.4

So now we can participate in the intimacy with the Triune God who is in constant dancing with each other in the Godhead. We of course, not as god, but as a new creation in Christ.

Through these He has granted us His precious and magnificent promises, so that by them you may become partakers of the divine nature ... 2 Peter I:4a NASB

On that day you will know that I am in My Father and you are in Me, and I in you ... Jesus answered and said to him, "If anyone loves Me, he will follow My word; and My Father will love him and we will come to him and make Our dwelling with him. John 14:20, 23 NASB

I didn't have room for John 17:21-26 NASB you might want to follow up with that as well.


