

## From the Pastor's Desk



## A "Full" Barn... An "Empty Soul" 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday's Gospel (Luke 12: 13-21) offers us one of the most striking and sobering parables of the Lord: **the Parable of the Rich Fool.** 

A man approaches Jesus, asking Him to intervene in a family inheritance dispute. But instead of addressing the matter directly, our Lord offers a warning: "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

In the parable that follows, a wealthy man is blessed with a plentiful harvest. Rather than giving thanks and seeking how he might serve others or honor God with his abundance, he thinks only of himself: "I will store up my goods... then say to myself, 'Rest, eat, drink, be merry!"" But God calls him "a fool", for that very night his life would be required of him. What he stored up would be left behind, and his soul would face judgment.

#### Three lessons stand out:

- 1. **Greed is not just about wealth; it is about the heart**. We can be greedy for comfort, admiration, or control. When our hearts are filled with the desire to possess more, we slowly forget our dependence on God.
- 2. True riches are measured not by what we accumulate, but by what we offer in love, in generosity, in faith. Because what we keep, we lose, but what we give, we gain forever!
- 3. **This life is short!** Eternity is not a distant idea. It is the ultimate reality. This Sunday's Gospel Reading is not opposed to planning or success. It is opposed to forgetting God in the entire process.

As summer passes and the days begin to shorten, may we remember that our lives, too, are passing. Let us not be caught unaware. Instead, may we be like **wise stewards**, whose hearts are fixed on heaven, and whose treasures are stored where no moth destroys and no thief breaks in.

## **Catholic News from Near and Far**

#### Miracle Officially Declared in Rhode Island

July 18, 2025 - Pope Leo XIV officially recognized a miraculous healing that took place in Rhode Island in 2007, attributed to the intercession of Venerable Salvador Valera Parra, a revered 19th-century Spanish priest. The miracle involved the unexpected and complete recovery of a baby born critically ill, now widely celebrated as an affirmation of God's healing power and the loving intercession of those who have gone before us. The Vatican's recognition has deeply moved the local faithful, inspiring thanksgiving and renewed devotion as the cause advances toward possible sainthood.

#### **Vatican Hosts Global Summit on Digital Evangelization**

July 8–11, 2025 - Over 1,000 priests, friars, and religious gathered in Rome for a groundbreaking symposium on Evangelization in the Digital Age. The event, titled "Light Unto the Screens", featured popular clergy influencers such as Fr. Cosimo Schena and Fr. Giuseppe Fusari, known for their online ministry through Instagram and YouTube. Participants exchanged strategies on sharing the Gospel with brevity, clarity, and authenticity, especially aimed at younger generations.

## Catholic Relief Efforts Expand in Africa

July 18, 2025 - Catholic agencies, including Caritas Internationalis and several diocesan charities, have joined forces to provide emergency assistance to communities affected by severe flooding in Mozambique and Malawi. Led by the local bishops' conferences, these efforts are not only supplying food, shelter, and medical aid, but also reinforcing long-term recovery through parish-based outreach. Pope Leo XIV sent a special message of encouragement, calling the Church's charitable mission "a visible sign of God's tenderness in the world."

### **Jubilee of Young People**

July 28 – August 3, 2025 - Thousands of young adults (ages 18–35) are gathering in Rome for the Jubilee of Young People, a joyful week of pilgrimage, catechesis, and Eucharistic celebration. The theme, "Pilgrims of Hope," invites youth from every continent to rediscover the beauty of the faith. A highlight will be the veneration of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati's incorrupt body, presented in Rome's Basilica of St. John Lateran.
