From the Pastor's Desk

Busy or Blessed?



Dear Parishioners,

In this Sunday's Gospel Reading (Luke 10:38-42), the 16th in Ordinary Time, we encounter Martha and Mary, who one day invited Jesus at their house for dinner. Martha is busy with all the details of hospitality: cleaning, preparing all the good food, and serving. Her sister Mary, instead, sits at the feet of Jesus, simply listening to his teaching. When Martha complains, Jesus responds with both clarity and kindness: "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things... Mary has chosen the better part."

Therefore today the Lord is gently reminding us that, amid all our busyness - especially when it's for good things - we must not forget **to sit** with Him, **to listen**, and **to be still**. This is not a rejection of hard work or service. **This is a call to keep our priorities in order.** Prayer must always come first because the dishes can wait, the emails can too, but the soul cannot!

Choosing "the better part" means trying to include more prayer in my life. Many people think that prayer is a complex task. It is not! It can be as simple as:

- Coming to daily Mass and /or putting more attentiveness and love in my Sunday Mass.
- Beginning the day with a short prayer, like: "Lord, I am Yours! Help me walk with you today."
- Stopping by church for a quiet moment during the week, letting God speak to my heart.
- Praying the Rosary or reading a short Gospel passage alone or with my family.

This week, let's ask ourselves: Am I making time for the Lord, or am I too busy for Him?

This Sunday Jesus is asking us for **a heart that listens**, a heart able to choose "the better part", the part that brings us closer to the Lord and enriches our lives. But let us also remember that **the Church needs both Martha and Mary**. The Christian life is a balance of **contemplation** and **action**: of **listening** to the Lord and **serving** Him in our neighbor.

With that spirit in mind, I invite you to help us prepare for our upcoming **Family Festival**, **August 14–17.** It is a beautiful opportunity to build up our parish family through **joyful service** and **shared celebration**. You can support the Festival by purchasing raffle tickets at the doors of the Church or offering your time as a volunteer during those days. Your presence and participation reflect both **the attentiveness of Mary** and **the generous spirit of Martha**.

Parish Social Ministry

A Church for the Poor, a Church Like Christ

One of the most striking marks of Pope Francis's pontificate has been his constant call for the Church to return to her Gospel roots: a Church that is close to the poor, shaped by humility, and radiant with the compassion of Christ. This vision is not new, but deeply rooted in the Gospel and the Church's tradition. In Evangelii Gaudium ("The Joy of the Gospel") #198, the Holy Father expresses this with clarity and conviction:

"For the Church, the option for the poor is primarily a theological category rather than a cultural, sociological, political or philosophical one. God shows the poor 'his first mercy'. This divine preference has consequences for the faith life of all Christians, since we are called to have 'this mind... which was in Jesus Christ' (Phil 2:5). Inspired by this, the Church has made an option for the poor which is understood as a 'special form of primacy in the exercise of Christian charity, to which the whole tradition of the Church bears witness'. This option – as Benedict XVI has taught – 'is implicit in our Christian faith in a God who became poor for us, so as to enrich us with his poverty'. This is why I want a Church which is poor and for the poor. They have much to teach us. ... In their difficulties they know the suffering Christ. We need to let ourselves be evangelized by them. (...) We are called to find Christ in them, to lend our voice to their causes, but also to be their friends, to listen to them, to speak for them and to embrace the mysterious wisdom which God wishes to share with us through them."

These words remind us that helping the poor is not merely an act of social kindness. It is a response to Christ Himself. In every act of service, we do not just reflect the Gospel; we encounter the living Christ. The poor evangelize us in return, reminding us of what truly matters: mercy, humility, and love.

May our parish and every Christian community strive to be, in the words of Pope Francis, "a Church which is poor and for the poor."
