



From the Pastor's Desk

The Knock That Heaven Hears

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time ~ Luke 11: 1-13



1. The School of Prayer

"Lord, teach us to pray." What a beautiful request!

The Apostles had seen many things - miracles, exorcisms, crowds fed - but it was the sight of Christ at prayer that stirred their hearts.

Why? Because prayer is the soul breathing.

Without prayer, we suffocate in a world of noise.

Jesus answers his Apostles not with lofty rhetoric, but with the *Our Father*, a prayer so divine in its structure, yet so simple - even a child can whisper it!

Prayer is not so much saying words as it is lifting the heart. The lips may move, but it is the soul that must reach Heaven.

2. The Knock That Will Not Cease

Then our Lord gives us this beautiful parable of a midnight visitor pounding on his friend's door. The lesson? **Perseverance.**

Not because God needs convincing, but because we need conversion.

Prayer doesn't change God; it changes us. It stretches the soul, widens the heart, and draws grace from the deep wells of Divine Mercy.

In today's Gospel Reading, Jesus reminds us that God the Father may delay in answering our prayers, but He never denies.

And that delay is the test of love.

3. The Father Gives... the Spirit

Finally, Jesus speaks not of gifts, but of **the Gift**: "How much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him?"

Too often, we ask for things. **We ought to ask to have the Spirit of God with us!** The Holy Spirit is the Fire of God's love. And to possess Him is to have everything.

This Week...

- Come to Church for some quiet time and speak to Him who waits.
- Pray the *Our Father* not as a routine, but as a lifeline.
- And remember: in a world that often forgets God, it is the soul that prays that holds back the flood of darkness.

The Meaning Behind the New Logo of our Parish



The official logo of Saints Cyril and Methodius Parish in Deer Park, NY, is rich in theological symbolism and historical depth, drawing from the sacred tradition of iconography to reflect the spiritual identity of our parish.

At the center are Saints Cyril and Methodius, the beloved "Apostles to the Slavs," whose missionary zeal and sanctity continue to inspire the faithful to this day.

Saint Cyril (827-869), born in Thessalonica, was a brilliant scholar, theologian, and linguist. He is best known for creating the Glagolitic alphabet, the first alphabet used to write the Old Church Slavonic language, which made the Scriptures and liturgy accessible to the Slavic peoples. Alongside his brother, he undertook

the great task of translating the Gospels and liturgical texts, thus planting the seeds of Christian faith and culture in Eastern Europe.

Saint Methodius (815 - 885), the older brother of Cyril, was a monk and later a bishop. A man of deep faith and administrative skill, he oversaw the growth of the Slavic Church and defended its legitimacy before both political and ecclesiastical authorities. He suffered opposition and even imprisonment for his efforts to uphold the use of the Slavic language in the liturgy, but persevered with humility and steadfastness.

In the image, Saint Cyril is shown holding the Gospel book, representing his role in translating the Sacred Scriptures in local languages. His brother, Saint Methodius is vested as a bishop, offering a gesture of blessing, symbolizing his pastoral mission and episcopal leadership.

Behind the saints stands a stylized church, a symbolic structure representing the Church that these two holy brothers helped establish and strengthen through their tireless evangelizing activity across Eastern Europe.

The entire image is encircled by a deep blue border with gold lettering that reads: *Saints Cyril and Methodius – Deer Park, NY*. Blue, in sacred art, represents heaven, wisdom, and divine mystery. Gold, the color of glory and sanctity, reminds us of the eternal light of Christ that guided the lives of these saints and continues to guide our parish community.

This logo is not merely decorative; it is a visual catechism: a reminder of our call to carry on the mission of Saints Cyril and Methodius by proclaiming the Gospel with courage, fidelity, and love.

THE ALTAR SERVER SACRISTY

Order, Beauty, and Reverence Restored.

We are pleased to share with our parish family that important work is currently underway in the Altar Servers' Sacristy: a space of great importance, though often unnoticed. This quiet room is being renewed with great care, uniting beauty, order, and reverence.

For many years, the sacristy had been in need of improvement. Storage was limited, furnishings had become worn, and the overall environment no longer reflected the dignity proper to a place so closely tied to the liturgy. With this in mind, a thoughtful and phased renovation of this sacred space is now in motion.

The work will include:

- Custom-built cabinets and storage units, which will provide proper organization for the Altar Servers' robes, and other liturgical items.
- Fresh paint and improved lighting, to brighten the room and make it more welcoming.
- A dedicated space for prayer and vesting, to foster a spirit of silence, recollection, and reverence before serving.
- The installation of a beautiful Crucifix and an image of the young Blessed Carlo Acutis, whose example of holiness inspires our young people to live their faith boldly.

This renovation is not simply cosmetic. It is formative. The sacristy is where Altar Servers learn



discipline, reverence, and the joy of serving the Church. It is where they prepare not just their Liturgical vestments, but their hearts. It is a place of quiet mentorship, prayer, and service.

The work is still ongoing, and we hope to complete it in the months ahead. We are deeply grateful to all who have made this project possible. If you would like to contribute financially toward the ongoing renovation, your support would be warmly and gratefully welcomed. Your generosity helps us continue forming young hearts in love for the Eucharist and service at the Altar.

May this renewed sacristy be a place where our young men and women begin their lifelong journey of service to God and His Church.


