A Word from Fr. Noel:

Set the Earth on Fire

20th Sunday in Ordinary Time



In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus makes a startling declaration: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" These words challenge the image of Jesus as merely gentle and peaceful. Instead, they reveal the fierce urgency and passion at the heart of His mission.

Jesus is not speaking of a destructive fire, but of a purifying one - the fire of the Holy Spirit, the fire of divine love and truth. This fire cleanses, refines, and transforms. It sets hearts ablaze with conviction, courage, and compassion. Jesus longs for this fire to spread, not just in a symbolic way, but in the real lives of His disciples.

He then goes on to say something even more jarring: "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." At first, this seems to contradict everything we associate with Jesus. After all, didn't the angels proclaim "peace on earth" at His birth? And didn't He preach love of neighbor and forgiveness?

Yes, Jesus is the Prince of Peace - but it is God's peace, not the peace of compromise or avoidance. True peace can only come through truth and conversion. And sometimes, when the light of Christ shines into dark places - whether in the world or in our own hearts - it causes tension. People resist change. They cling to what is comfortable or familiar. The Gospel forces a choice, and that can bring division, even within families.

This passage is not a call to conflict, but a sober reminder that following Christ comes with a cost. Discipleship isn't always met with applause. Speaking truth, living with integrity, and choosing love in a world that often rewards selfishness and indifference - these things can set us apart. Jesus is preparing His disciples - and us - for the reality that living for God will sometimes bring struggle, but it is a struggle that leads to freedom and life.

In a world that often prefers tolerance to truth, and comfort to conviction, this Gospel is a wake-up call. It asks us: Are we on fire for Christ, or are we lukewarm? Have we allowed the Holy Spirit to refine us, or do we resist His purifying flame?

May we have the courage to let Christ set our hearts ablaze. May we not fear the cost of discipleship, but embrace it with joy, knowing that His fire, though it may burn, will ultimately lead us to deeper love, deeper faith, and true peace.

May God Bless us all!

"The Lord is Gently Knocking" Pope Leo XIV's Message to Young People



Rome — **Aug 3, 2025:** At the Jubilee Mass for Young People, Pope Leo XIV addressed thousands gathered with a message full of hope, challenge, and encouragement: "Jesus is our hope - set out on an adventure with Him toward eternity."

Preaching from the same site where Saint John Paul II addressed youth in the Jubilee Year 2000, the Holy Father invited today's young Catholics to open their hearts to Christ, who gently "knocks at the window of your soul."

Reflecting on the Book of Ecclesiastes in the Old Testament, Pope Leo acknowledged the human experience of limitation and restlessness. "We are not made for a life that is static," he said, "but for one constantly renewed through self-gift in love." He warned against filling this spiritual thirst with "cheap imitations," encouraging the youth instead to let their longing lead them to God.

Citing Saint Augustine, the Pope recalled the famous confession: "You were within me, but I was outside..." - an echo of the spiritual journey many young people experience. "It is beautiful," he said, "especially at a young age, to open wide your hearts to Him."

Pope Leo urged youth not to settle for mediocrity or materialism. "Buying, hoarding, and consuming are not enough. We need to lift our eyes to what is above." True fulfillment, he said, comes through prayer, adoration, the Eucharist, Confession, and acts of charity.

He held up Blessed Piergiorgio Frassati and Blessed Carlo Acutis as modern examples of youthful holiness. "Aspire to great things," the Pope exhorted, "to holiness, wherever you are."

Finally, entrusting all young people to the Blessed Virgin Mary, especially during this 75th anniversary year of the Dogma of the Assumption, he prayed that they would return home as joyful witnesses of the Gospel.
