# From the Pastor's Desk

# One Master, One Heart

In this Sunday's Gospel Reading, Our Lord speaks words that are both sobering and liberating: "The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones" (Lk 16:10). At first glance, this might seem like



a simple lesson about honesty. But Jesus is teaching us something far deeper: our relationship with God is revealed not so much in grand gestures, but in the faithfulness of daily choices.

How often we imagine that holiness is reserved for the "big" moments of life! Yet, Christ reminds us that it is in the "small matters" - the hidden sacrifices, the quiet prayers, the patience with others, the little acts of charity - that we show whether we truly belong to Him. A soul that is faithful in the small things is ready to be entrusted with greater responsibility in the Kingdom.

Our Lord also warns us that we cannot serve two masters. Money and possessions are not evil in themselves. They are gifts meant to be used wisely. But if they become our master, our hearts will be divided, and divided hearts cannot belong fully to God.

This Gospel challenges us **to examine our loyalties**. Where do I place my trust: in God's providence or in my own security? Whom do I truly serve: Christ, or the passing things of this world?

Let us ask for the grace to be faithful in the little things, to live with simplicity, and to serve God with an undivided heart. In doing so, we will discover the true freedom and joy that comes from belonging wholly to the Lord.

# From a Memo recently sent out by the Catholic Vote Organization:

"The New York State Assembly passed a bill to legalize assisted suicide nearly three months ago. It still hasn't been signed. The legislature has not yet sent it to Gov. Kathy Hochul's desk, and that appears to be intentional.

We're hearing that Gov. Hochul is torn over whether to sign it. Though she is a hardcore leftist, Gov. Hochul should understand that **assisted suicide is an exploitation of the poor, disabled, and mentally unwell.** Suffering people in places where it is legal are often pressured into assisted suicide because of an inability to pay for long-term care or because they feel like a burden to others.

Cardinal Timothy Dolan reported that he has personally urged Gov. Hochul, a self-identified Catholic, to veto the bill. Did she listen? The buzz is that Democrat leadership in the legislature is withholding the bill to give Gov. Hochul time to decide what she wants to do."

Encourage Gov. Hochul to veto the bill. Send a MESSAGE using this QR CODE:

**Evangelization and witness:** The celebration reminds all Catholics, not just appointed catechists, of their baptismal responsibility to be witnesses to the Gospel. As Pope Francis has taught, this witness involves accompanying others at every stage of their faith journey, reflecting the Catholic social teaching principle of community and participation.

**Sharing the "hope" of social justice:** An explanation for our "hope" involves articulating how our faith inspires us to build a more just and peaceful world, as exemplified by the teachings on justice and care for the poor found in the day's readings.

# **Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion - Part A**

This training is required for all new Ministers.
