From the Pastor's Desk

Lazarus at our doorstep...

In this Sunday's Gospel, Our Lord gives us the sobering parable of the rich man and the poor man, Lazarus. The rich man lived each day in comfort and luxury, while DEER PARK, NY

Lazarus, hungry and suffering, sat at his gate longing for crumbs. After death, however, their places are reversed: Lazarus is carried to the bosom of Abraham, while the rich man finds himself in torment.

This parable is not simply about wealth or poverty, but about **the blindness of the heart.** The rich man's sin was not that he was wealthy, but that he failed to see Lazarus - failed to notice his suffering neighbor right at his doorstep. True discipleship requires us to open our eyes to those in need around us, to see Christ in the poor, the sick, the lonely, and the forgotten.

Our Lord also reminds us of **the urgency of conversion**: "They have Moses and the prophets; let them listen to them." In other words, God has already spoken to us through His Word and through the teaching of the Church. We cannot wait for dramatic signs or miracles to change our hearts. **The time to act, to love, and to serve is now.**

This weekend's **Parish Ministry Fair** is a concrete opportunity to do just that. By offering our time and talents, we open our eyes and hearts, not only to the needs of our parish family but also to the wider community. **May our participation in parish life be a living sign of the conversion to which Christ calls us.**

Introducing

THE VEN. FR. ANTHONY VINCENT GALLO

It is with joy that we introduce to our parish community the figure of Venerable Father Anthony Vincent Gallo (1899 -1934), a humble priest whose short life was marked by holiness, sacrifice, and deep love for God's people.

He was born on January 11, 1899, in Monteforte Irpino, a picturesque town in southern Italy. His parents, Anthony and Angela, were deeply religious and instilled in their children devotion to Mary Immaculate and faithfulness to the Church. From his youth, Vincent showed remarkable purity, patience, and devotion, often spending long moments in prayer. In the presence of his brothers, he once declared: "With the help of God, I will prepare myself to become a holy priest."



After entering religious life, he pursued his secondary and theological studies in Bologna, where he was noted for his diligence and charity. He completed his Licentiate in Theology in 1922 and continued his priestly formation with a spirit of humility and zeal. On December 14, 1930, in the Church of St. Nicholas in his hometown, he was ordained a priest by Bishop Petronelli of Avellino. His priesthood, though brief, was marked by self-sacrifice and deep union with the Cross of Christ.

As a priest, Father Gallo gave himself wholeheartedly to the care of the sick and the poor. Tireless in his ministry, he comforted the suffering, prepared the dying for their final journey, and was remembered as an "angel of consolation." Strikingly, he foretold his own early death when consoling a gravely ill youth, telling him: "Courage! Courage! Within two years we will be together in paradise."

True to his words, Father Gallo died in 1934 at only 35 years old.



The Church has recognized the heroic nature of his virtues, declaring him Venerable. For us today, he is a shining reminder that holiness is found not in grand gestures, but in daily fidelity, prayer, and charity toward others.

As we learn more about Venerable Father Vincent Gallo, let us pray that, if it is God's will, he may one day be raised to the honors of the Altar as a Saint of the Church. May his example inspire us to live our faith with the same simplicity, devotion, and courage.


