



This Sunday's Gospel (John 3:13–17) leads us directly to the heart of our faith: "God so loved the world that



Jesus reminds us that just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up. The Cross, once an instrument of shame, becomes **the throne of mercy**. From that wood flows the healing of our souls and the promise of everlasting life. We are not saved by our own strength, but **by the pierced Heart of Christ** who poured Himself out completely for us.



# TWO YOUNG WITNESSES OF FAITH CARLO ACUTIS and PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI

On Sunday, September 7, 2025, the Church celebrated the canonization of two young men whose lives exemplify holiness in the modern world: Blessed Carlo Acutis and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati.

Pope Leo XIV presided over the ceremony in St. Peter's Square, marking a historic moment as the first millennial saint was elevated to sainthood alongside a beloved figure of the early 20th century.

Carlo Acutis (1991–2006) was a teenager from Italy who loved computers, video games, and sports. Yet above all, he loved the Eucharist, which he called his "highway to Heaven." He created a website to catalog Eucharistic miracles, reminding us that holiness is not about doing extraordinary things, but about living ordinary life with extraordinary love. Carlo had been beatified by Pope

Francis on October 10, 2020, and his canonization in 2025 makes him the first millennial saint.

Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901–1925), known as the "Man of the Beatitudes," was a joyful young man who loved mountain climbing, friendship, and prayer. He dedicated his short life to serving the poor and living his faith with courage and joy. Pier Giorgio had been beatified by Pope St. John Paul II on May 20, 1990, and his canonization in 2025 celebrated his enduring example for young people around the world.


Both Acutis and Frassati remind us that holiness is not reserved for priests or religious alone. It is the vocation of every Christian. Both saints show us that one can be young, modern, and fully immersed in the world, while also being deeply rooted in Christ.

May their examples encourage us to find Christ in the Eucharist, serve Him in the poor, and live each day with joy, courage, and faith.



Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle; be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil.

May God rebuke him, we humbly pray: and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, thrust into Hell Satan and all of the other evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen

## Living the Liturgy:

# FROM THE CROSS TO THE MOTHER'S HEART



Each September, the Church gives us two powerful feasts placed side by side: the Exaltation of the Holy Cross (today, Sunday, September 14) and the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows (tomorrow, Monday, September 15).

The **Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross** goes back to the early centuries of the Church. In the year 326, St. Helena, the mother of the Emperor Constantine, traveled to Jerusalem and discovered the True Cross on which Christ was crucified. A great basilica was later built on the site of Calvary and the Holy Sepulchre, and its dedication on September 14 became the date of this feast. From then on, the Church has celebrated the Cross, not as a symbol of defeat, but as the instrument of our salvation. As we lift high the Cross in liturgy and in life, we proclaim with St. Paul: "We preach Christ crucified...the power of God and the wisdom of God" (1 Cor 1:23-24).

Tomorrow, Monday, September 15, we turn to the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows. This

devotion developed from the Middle Ages, especially through the Servite Order, who honored Mary's participation in the suffering of her Son. The seven sorrows of Our Lady include Simeon's prophecy, the flight into Egypt, the loss of the Child Jesus, the meeting on the way of the Cross, the Crucifixion, the taking down of Jesus' body, and His burial. Mary, standing at the foot of the Cross, shares in Christ's suffering in a unique way, becoming for us a model of faithful love and a motherly refuge in our own sorrows.

Placed together, these feasts remind us that the Cross is never separated from love. Christ carried it out of love for us, and Mary stood beneath it out of love for Him. When life places its crosses on our shoulders, let us remember: through the Cross comes Resurrection, and through Mary's sorrows comes the joy of Christ.

The Diocese of Rockville Center invites those interested in serving as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors to participate in upcoming training.

We kindly ask that you register in advance with a letter from your pastor, as walk-ins cannot be accommodated.

### **Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion - Part A**

This training is required for all new Ministers.

All new Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC) must complete BASIC (Part A) training.

If you wish to provide ministry in hospitals, nursing homes, or to the homebound, you must also complete Part B training. <u>Please note</u>: Part A training must be completed before attending Part B training. Lector Workshop is also available for new and experienced lectors. You cannot attend *EMHC Part A* and the Lector Workshop on the same day. Each session must be attended separately.
