From the Pastor's Desk

No Half-Hearted Followers!

This Sunday's Gospel Reading (Luke 14:25–33) presents one of the most challenging teachings of Our Lord: "Whoever does not carry his cross and follow me cannot be my disciple."



Jesus speaks not of half-hearted discipleship, but of **total commitment**. He even uses strong language about "hating" father, mother, and one's own life, not to dismiss love for family, but to underline that **nothing can take precedence over Him.**

To follow Christ is not a casual decision. It is like the builder who first counts the cost before starting a tower, or the king who weighs the strength of his army before battle. Jesus is asking us to do the same: to count the cost of discipleship. Faith is not merely a matter of convenience, but of sacrifice, perseverance, and daily carrying the cross.

This does not mean that following Christ is joyless. On the contrary, when we give Him first place, everything else in life finds its proper order. Family, work, possessions - all are received as blessings, but they do not own us. Christ alone is our treasure, our strength, and our peace.

As we reflect on this call to wholehearted discipleship, we also pause this week to remember the tragic events of September 11, 2001. In faith and in hope, we lift up to God all the victims, the heroes, and the families forever marked by that day. We will gather for a Memorial Mass on Thursday, September 11, at 7:00 pm in our church, asking the Lord of mercy to grant eternal rest to the departed and healing to all who still carry that cross of loss.

Chicago-Style Pizza Hand-Delivered to Pope Leo XIV



On Wednesday, July 30, 2025, during the Jubilee of Youth in Rome, Catholic influencers **Jayden Remias** and **Madeline Daley** pulled off a mission that was equal parts whimsical and faith-filled: hand-delivering an authentic Chicago-style pizza to Pope Leo XIV.

Inspired by a 2015 viral video of Pope Francis receiving pizza, Remias dreamed of bringing his Chicago-native Pope a slice of home. With time and money short, he entrusted Daley - already

traveling to Rome - with a carefully packed Aurelio's pizza.

After a near disaster when housekeeping almost threw the pizza away, Daley prayed, and the box was miraculously recovered. Arriving early to the papal audience with a sign reading, "We have Aurelio's pizza," she caught the Pope's attention. He lit up, gave a thumbs-up, and asked his guards to retrieve the pizza for the Popemobile.

The Pope's brother later confirmed that the Holy Father enjoyed the 6-inch pepperoni pie. For Remias, though, it was never just about food: "This silly act showed how specifically God loves us. If we listen to His voice and follow Him - even when outcomes are uncertain - we bring His love into the world."

Even in a box of pizza, the joy of God's providence was served.


