





The OCIA Process in our Parish

What is the OCIA (formerly known as the RCIA)? OCIA stands for "ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS." It is for non-Catholic adults seeking to join the Catholic Church and for Catholic adults who need to complete the remaining Sacraments of Initiation. Through OCIA, eligible adults learn about the Catholic faith and become full members of the Church. Each year, new members join through OCIA.

Do you know an adult interested in becoming Catholic who has not been baptized? Any adult who is not baptized and wishes to prepare for Baptism, Confirmation, and First Eucharist should call Deacon James at the Parish Center: 631-667-4044 (Ext. 100). This also applies to baptized adults of other Christian faiths.

Adult Catholics who never received First Eucharist and/or Confirmation: If you are a baptized Catholic adult who hasn't completed the Sacraments of Initiation, you are invited to join. Contact Deacon James with any questions or concerns.

A Saint in the Making

The Early Life of Venerable Father Anthony Vincent Gallo



Some weeks ago, we introduced to our Parish community the Venerable Father Anthony Vincent Gallo, as we continue to pray that one day he may be canonized and declared a saint of the Catholic Church.

During this month of November - dedicated to all the saints - we will explore more closely the life of this holy priest whose example continues to inspire faith and devotion.

Father Anthony Vincent Gallo was born on January 11, 1899, in Monteforte Irpino, a small town in southern Italy. His parents,

Anthony and Angela Piciocchi, were deeply religious and devoted to the Blessed Mother. Her image adorned the doorway of their home, and a small lamp burned before it day and night. The family prayed the Rosary each evening and celebrated the Feast of the Immaculate Conception with great joy. Their home was also known for its hospitality toward the poor.

Anthony, the seventh of nine children, was baptized the day he was born. From a young age, he showed a remarkable goodness of heart, a spirit of sacrifice, and a sincere love for God. The day of his First Holy Communion, received in the same church where he had been baptized, was the happiest day of his life. After returning home, he spent hours in prayer before the image of Our Lady, giving thanks to Jesus with childlike faith.

But early in life, Anthony learned the mystery of the Cross. When he was only ten, his father died after a long illness, leaving his mother with nine children to care for. Not long after, Anthony was placed in a local orphanage—a painful separation that tested his young heart but strengthened his trust in God's providence. Even in sorrow, he showed the virtues that would later mark his priestly life: faith, simplicity, charity, and complete abandonment to God's will.
