
From the Pastor's Desk




wishes to dwell among us with His peace and grace.

MARY, THE NEW EVE

As we journey through Advent, the Church invites us to renew our hope in the Messiah who comes to heal and restore. One of the most profound signs of this hope is the Blessed Virgin Mary, whose humble "yes" opened the way for the Savior. An especially moving meditation for this season is the image *Mary and Eve* (2005) by **Sr. Grace Remington**, which beautifully portrays Mary as the New Eve.

In the artwork, Eve stands holding the fruit of the Fall, her posture marked by sorrow. A serpent coils around her feet -

an image of humanity's struggle with sin. Mary stands before her, serene and expectant, gently drawing Eve's hand toward the Child in her womb. At Mary's feet, we notice a striking detail: she is stepping upon the very serpent that entangles Eve. This echoes the ancient promise of Genesis: "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; He will strike at your head" (Genesis 3:15). In this quiet encounter between two women, we see the dawn of redemption.

The Church Fathers saw Mary's role with remarkable clarity. **St. Irenaeus** wrote, "The knot of Eve's disobedience was loosed by the obedience of Mary; for what the virgin Eve bound by unbelief, the Virgin Mary unbound by faith."

St. Ambrose of Milan echoed this truth, reminding us, "Through Mary, the gateway of salvation was opened to all."

Advent is the season where longing meets promise. Eve represents the cry of humanity for healing and restoration. Mary, the New Eve, embodies God's tender response: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel" (Matthew 1:23). Through her faith and obedience, she becomes the vessel of the One who "makes all things new" (Revelation 21:5).

As Christmas draws near, this image by Sr. Grace Remington encourages us to place our own wounds, fears, and hopes into Mary's hands. Just as she consoles Eve, she leads each of us to her Son, the One who conquers the serpent and brings the light that no darkness can overcome.


