




## **Treasures for the Eucharistic King**



## THE "JESSE TREE" IN OUR SANCTUARY



Those who come to our church during these Advent days will notice the *Jesse Tree* placed beside the ambo. Many may wonder what it is, and why it holds such a special place in our preparations for Christmas.

The Jesse Tree is an ancient Christian tradition that traces the family lineage and the history of salvation leading to the birth of Our Lord. It takes its name from Jesse, the father of King David. The prophet Isaiah proclaimed, "A shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse," reminding God's people that the Messiah would arise from this royal line. Each ornament on the Jesse Tree represents a figure from the Old Testament who helped prepare the way for Christ. They stand as stepping stones quiding us toward the manger in Bethlehem.

Here in our Parish, we will place four ornaments on the Jesse Tree, one for each Sunday of Advent. Last Sunday, at the 9:30 AM Family Mass, we hung the first ornament, depicting Noah, who teaches us hope, obedience, and trust as we journey toward Christ. We are grateful to Ms. Darlene Vietri, our Parish Secretary, for preparing the beautiful ornaments that will adorn our Jesse Tree. The children at the Family Mass also received a handout of Noah's ornament to color, cut out, and place on their own Jesse Tree at home.

Each Sunday of Advent, a new ornament will be added to the Parish Jesse Tree, and the children will continue to receive a copy of it to take home and place on their personal Jesse Trees. In this way, our youngest parishioners can follow the story of salvation week by week, growing in wonder as Christmas draws near.

As these ornaments are added, both here in church and in the homes of our families, we remember how faithfully God prepared the world for His Son. May this beautiful tradition help us enter Advent with renewed joyful expectation. And let the Jesse Tree remind us that the story of our salvation is long, rich, and ever unfolding, leading our hearts ever closer to Christ.

## **Pope Leo XIV Encourages Young Catholics:**"Let Technology Serve Faith, Not Replace It!"



On Friday, November 15, 2025, more than 15,000 teenagers gathered in Indianapolis for the *National Catholic Youth Conference* and connected live with Pope Leo XIV.

The Holy Father welcomed their questions on mercy, mental health,

technology, and the future of the Church, urging them to deepen their friendship with Jesus Christ.

Pope Leo reminded the youth that the Sacraments, especially Confession, are real encounters with God's mercy. Sin never has the final word, he said, encouraging them to approach the Lord with confidence and trust. Speaking also about sadness and anxiety, the Pope invited young people to open their hearts to Jesus in quiet prayer, especially before the Blessed Sacrament. He encouraged them to lean on trusted adults and to seek friendships that lead them closer to Christ.

On technology, he praised its value for prayer, learning, and connection, while cautioning that it can never replace real relationships or worship together at Mass. Even with artificial intelligence, he said, technology must serve human growth, not diminish it. "Al can never replace the unique gift that you are to the world."

Looking to the future, Pope Leo affirmed that young Catholics are not only the future of the Church, but also her present. He urged them to be active in their parishes, faithful to Sunday Mass, and open to God's call in their lives. He concluded by encouraging youth to be friends of Christ and builders of unity, avoiding political labels in matters of faith. "The world needs missionaries," he said. "It needs you to share the light and joy you have found in Jesus."
