

Called “Beloved” at the Jordan

With the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the Church brings the Christmas season to a solemn close. In the Gospel Reading taken from that of Matthew (3:13–17), Jesus steps into the waters of the Jordan to be baptized by John - an act filled with humility and profound meaning. Though sinless, **Our Lord chooses to stand among us**, teaching from the very beginning of His public ministry that God draws near not through power, but through loving closeness.


As Jesus rises from the water, the heavens open, the Spirit descends like a dove, and the Father's voice is heard: “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.” Before Jesus performs a miracle or preaches a word, **He is affirmed in love**. 




At the heart of the logo are Saints Cyril and Methodius, our patron

saints. They stand as teachers and shepherds, reminding us that our Parish was founded upon the proclamation of the Word of God and the unity of faith and culture.

The **circular seal** speaks of continuity and faithfulness across generations. For seventy years, countless parishioners have been baptized, married, forgiven, and commended to God within this sacred community. The circle reminds us that the Church is not merely a building, but a living body, ever ancient and ever new.

The colors are equally intentional. **Deep blue** evokes faith and stability - virtues that have sustained the parish through changing times. It also recalls the heavens, lifting our eyes toward God. **Gold** represents hope and thanksgiving. It honors the sacrifices of those who came before us and reflects the enduring value of a faith handed on with love. The **flowing lines**, then, suggest a journey, rooted in tradition, yet moving forward with confidence into the future, guided by the Holy Spirit.

Together, this logo is more than a commemorative image. It is a **profession of faith** and a **word of gratitude**. It proclaims that what began in 1956 by God's grace continues today by that same grace. As the Psalmist reminds us: "**The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy**" (Psalm 126:3).

The Blessing of the Sacred Heart Statue and the new Adoration Candelabra

On Sunday, December 28, the Feast of the Holy Family, our Parish was blessed with a special moment at the conclusion of Holy Mass: the blessing of a new statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and two candelabra for Eucharistic Adoration.

The statue of the Sacred Heart, a generous gift from **Mr. and Mrs. Michael and Connie Santoli**, is a precious antique dating from the end of the 19th century. It was crafted in Paris by the renowned *Raffl Statuary*, founded by Ignaz Raffl (1828–1895). This historic workshop is known for its outstanding sacred art, including works found at the Lourdes Shrine in France. Having such a statue in our church beautifully connects our Parish to the Church's rich artistic and devotional tradition.

Along with the statue, two large brass candelabra bearing the image of the Sacred Heart and the Christogram "IHS" were blessed. These elegant candelabra, donated by **Mrs. Lala De Gracia**, will enhance the reverence of our weekly Eucharistic Adoration.

I am sincerely grateful to our benefactors for their generosity. May the Sacred Heart of Jesus bless them abundantly, and may these sacred gifts deepen the prayer of all who worship here.





Living the Liturgy

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord A "Theophany" in the Liturgy of the Church



In the Western Church, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord brings the Christmas season to its solemn conclusion. In the Eastern Churches, this same mystery is celebrated as **Theophany** - the manifestation of God - highlighting its profound theological and liturgical importance. East and West together contemplate one great truth: **in the baptism of Jesus, God reveals Himself to the world.**

In the liturgy, we are taken to the Jordan River, where Christ enters the waters not to be cleansed, but to cleanse. Eastern theology emphasizes that creation itself is renewed at this moment. As Christ descends into the Jordan, the waters are sanctified, and through them all of creation is blessed. The hymnography of the East proclaims: **"When You, O Lord, were baptized in the Jordan, the worship of the Trinity was made manifest."**

The liturgy places strong emphasis on **the revelation of the Holy Trinity**. The Son stands in the waters, the Spirit descends like a dove, and the Father's voice is heard from heaven. This is not only an historical event, but a living mystery made present whenever the Church celebrates it in prayer and song.

The Eastern tradition also links the Baptism of the Lord with the entire beginning of Christ's saving mission. From the Jordan, **He is led into the desert**, where He prepares through prayer and obedience. Soon after, **at Cana**, He reveals His glory by transforming water into wine. In the liturgical life of the Church, these moments are not isolated events but unfolding manifestations of the same divine light.

This feast invites us to rediscover **our own baptism**. In both Eastern and Western theology, baptism is **participation in Christ's death and resurrection**, a true rebirth, and an anointing by the Holy Spirit. As the liturgy proclaims this mystery, we are reminded that we are a baptized people, called to reflect Christ's light in the world.

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, may the Church's liturgy - rich in word, symbol, and song - draw us more deeply into the mystery of Christ, who sanctifies creation and reveals the glory of the Triune God.
